FISCAL ANALYSIS

ASSUMPTION

SCR 5 - Lead Industry Task Force:

Officials from the **Missouri House of Representatives** assume the House can absorb the expenses of members on the task force.

Officials from the **Department of Natural Resources** and the **Missouri Senate** each assume the proposal would not fiscally impact their respective agencies.

Oversight notes upon approval of the concurrent resolution task force members would receive reimbursement for their actual and necessary expenses incurred in attending meetings of the committee.

Oversight notes the Task Force will terminate by December 31, 2016 or before. Therefore, reimbursement of meeting expenses could occur in the current fiscal year, in FY16, or the first 6 months of FY17.

Oversight assumes reimbursement costs of the Task Force would be paid from the Missouri House and Senate Joint Contingent Fund, and these expenses could be absorbed by the fund. This fund receives normal appropriations for various business and legislative committee activity.
