#### FISCAL ANALYSIS

#### **ASSUMPTION**

Officials from the **Department of Corrections (DOC)** state this bill, if passed into law, creates crimes related to counterfeit, fake, diluted, or black market drugs.

Based upon historical data, DOC assumes that approximately three offenders would be sentenced to supervision, either probation or incarceration, under this new legislation. DOC assumes that two of the offenders would receive probation and one would be incarcerated. Probationers would serve, on average, three years of probation. The average prison time served for these types of D felonies is 12 months. The FY14 average cost of supervision is \$6.72 per offender per day or an annual cost of \$2,453 per offender. The DOC cost of incarceration is \$16.725 per day or an annual cost of \$6,105 per offender.

In summary, supervision by the DOC would likely result in additional costs of probation or incarceration for each additional offender sentenced under this legislation. DOC assumes a cost of \$0 to \$9,176 in FY 2016, \$0 to \$16,235 in FY 2017, and \$0 to \$21,664 in FY 2018.

**Oversight** assumes the DOC could absorb these potential additional costs within their current appropriation level.

Officials from the **Office of Prosecution Services (OPS)** assume the proposal would not have a measurable fiscal impact on their agency. The creation of a new crime creates additional responsibilities for county prosecutors which may, in turn, result in additional costs which are difficult to determine.

For the purpose of this proposed legislation, officials at the **Office of State Public Defender** (**SPD**) cannot assume that existing staff will provide effective representation for any new cases arising where indigent persons are charged with the proposed new crime of failure to report dangerous activity of a pharmacist, a new class D felony.

While the number of new cases (or cases with increased penalties) may be too few or uncertain to request additional funding for this specific bill, the SPD will continue to request sufficient appropriations to provide effective representation in all cases where the right to counsel attaches.

**Oversight** assumes the SPD can absorb the additional caseload that may result from this proposal.
