**Bill Summary:** This proposal requires long-term care facilities to be encouraged to institute policies facilitating familial involvement in the well-being and support of its residents.

- No direct fiscal impact on the state is anticipated.


Local Fiscal Highlights

Fiscal Analysis

Officials from the **Department of Health and Senior Services** assume the proposal would not fiscally impact their agency.

The proposal may have a minimal administrative impact on small business long-term care facilities if they develop and implement policies to encourage familial involvement of residents. Also, this legislation is not federally mandated, would not duplicate any other program and would not require additional capital improvements or rental space.
