FISCAL ANALYSIS

ASSUMPTION

Oversight was unable to receive some of the agency responses in a timely manner due to the short fiscal note request time. Oversight has presented this fiscal note on the best current information that we have or on prior year information regarding a similar bill. Upon the receipt of agency responses, Oversight will review to determine if an updated fiscal note should be prepared and seek the necessary approval of the chairperson of the Joint Committee on Legislative Research to publish a new fiscal note.

In response to similar legislation from the current session, SB 167, officials from the **Department of Social Services (DSS)** stated the proposal will have no fiscal impact on their organization. The **DSS, Divisions of MO HealthNet (MHD)** and **Legal Services (DLS)** stated the proposed legislation grants a one-year extension for the Pharmacy Tax.

The proposed legislation allows the MHD to collect \$57,039,249 in pharmacy tax, which will allow MHD to draw in federal funds of \$98,478,511 in FY 2016. The FY 2016 budget submitted by the DSS assumed the pharmacy tax would continue through FY 2016. If the proposed legislation does not pass, additional General Revenue funds of \$57,039,249 would be needed to continue the current level of services.

In response to SB 167, officials from the **Department of Health and Senior Services** assumed the proposal would not fiscally impact their organization.

Officials from the **Office of Administration - Division of Budget and Planning (B&P)** state this proposal will not impact Total State Revenue and the proposal will not impact the calculation under Article X, Section 18(e). The proposal extends pharmacy reimbursement allowance tax to September 30, 2016.

Officials from **Legislative Research, Revisor of Statutes** assume the proposal would not fiscally impact their agency.

No direct fiscal impact to small businesses would be expected as a result of this proposal.


FISCAL DESCRIPTION
