## § 260.283 - Paper and Plastic Bags:

**Oversight** was unable to receive some of the agency responses in a timely manner due to the short fiscal note request time. Oversight has presented this fiscal note on the best current information that we have or on prior year information regarding a similar bill. Upon the receipt of agency responses, Oversight will review to determine if an updated fiscal note should be prepared and seek the necessary approval of the chairperson of the Joint Committee on Legislative Research to publish a new fiscal note.

Officials from the **Department of Natural Resources**, **Department of Economic Development**, the **Office of the Attorney General**, and the **City of Jefferson** each assume the proposal would not fiscally impact their respective agencies.

Officials from the **City of Columbia** did not respond to **Oversight's** request for fiscal impact.
