ASSUMPTION

§ 260.283 - Paper, Plastic, and Reusable Bags:

§ 285.055 - Political subdivision regulation of the minimum wage:

FISCAL IMPACT - Small Business

§ 260.283 - Paper, Plastic, and Reusable Bags:

This provision would allow small business merchants, vendors, and peddlers to continue offering paper or plastic bags to their customers, and consumers could not be prevented from using reusable bags in small businesses by a political subdivision.

§ 285.055 - Political subdivision regulation of the minimum wage:

This provision prohibits a political subdivision from mandating a minimum wage on small businesses higher than the requirements of federal, state laws, rules, or regulations.

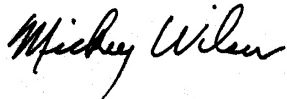
FISCAL DESCRIPTION
