FISCAL IMPACT - Small Business

§ 260.283 - Paper, Plastic, and Reusable Bags:

This provision would allow small business merchants, vendors, and peddlers to continue offering paper or plastic bags to their customers, and consumers could <u>not</u> be prevented from using reusable bags in small businesses by a political subdivision.

§ 285.055 - Political subdivision regulation of the minimum wage:

This provision prohibits a political subdivision from mandating a minimum wage on small businesses higher than the requirements of federal, state laws, rules, or regulations.

FISCAL DESCRIPTION

The proposed legislation appears to have no direct fiscal impact.

This legislation is not federally mandated, would not duplicate any other program and would not require additional capital improvements or rental space.
