**Subject:** Annexation; Cities, Towns and Villages; Counties; Roads and Highways

**Bill Summary:** This proposal requires cities, towns, and villages proposing to annex a

portion of a state highway to also annex a specified portion of the area on

either side of the highway.

#### State Fiscal Highlights

• No direct fiscal impact on the state is anticipated.

#### Local Fiscal Highlights

• No direct fiscal impact on local political subdivisions is anticipated.

### Fiscal Analysis

Officials at the **Department of Public Safety's Missouri Highway Patrol** and the **Missouri Department of Transportation** each assume no fiscal impact to their respective agencies from this proposal.

Officials at the **City of Kansas City** assume an unknown cost from this proposal. Because this proposal would increase the area required to be annexed, it would increase the area to which the City services must be provided. The cost would depend on a particular fact situation and the specific amount of additional area required to be annexed.

**Oversight** assumes this proposal would be permissive in nature and would be up to a governing body to decide if it would be cost effective for the local political subdivision to seek an annexation of an area.
