ASSUMPTION

In response to the previous version of this proposal, officials at the Office of the Secretary of State, the Office of the State Courts Administrator, the Metropolitan St. Louis Sewer District, the St. Louis County Board of Election Commission and the Platte County Board of Election Commission each assumed the proposal would not fiscally impact their respective agencies.

Senate Amendment 1

§393.015 - Non-payment of a sewer bill

In response to similar legislation (HB 824), officials at the **Metropolitan St. Louis Sewer District**, the **City of O'Fallon** and the **City of Kansas City** each assumed no fiscal impact to their respective entities from this proposal.

In response to similar legislation from 2014, HB 2079, officials at the City of Jefferson, the City of Columbia and the Cole County Public Water District Number 3 each assumed no fiscal impact to their respective entities from this proposal.

Officials at the following cities: Ashland, Belton, Bernie, Bonne Terre, Boonville, California, Cape Girardeau, Clayton, Dardenne Prairie, Excelsior Springs, Florissant, Frontenac, Fulton, Gladstone, Grandview, Harrisonville, Independence, Joplin, Kearney, Knob Noster, Ladue, Lake Ozark, Lee Summit, Liberty, Louisiana, Maryland Heights, Maryville, Mexico, Monett, Neosho, Pacific, Peculiar, Pineville, Popular Bluff, Raytown, Republic, Richmond, Rolla, Sedalia, Springfield, St. Charles, St. Louis, St. Robert, Sugar Creek, Sullivan, Warrensburg, Warrenton, Webb City, Weldon Spring and West Plains did not respond to **Oversight's** request for fiscal impact.

Officials at the following water and sewer districts: Boone County Regional Sewer District, Cole County Public Water District #4, Franklin County Water District, Little Blue Valley Sewer District, Pulaski County Sewer District and the St. Charles County Public Water Supply District did not respond to **Oversight's** request for fiscal impact.

ASSUMPTION (continued)

Senate Amendment 2

§ 644.145 - Clean Water Law:

In response to similar legislation (HB 1058), officials from the **Department of Natural Resources (DNR)** assumed this proposal would add public water or sewer treatment works to the types of facilities DNR would be required to make finding of affordability determinations when issuing permits that incorporate a new requirement for discharges.

DNR assumed this proposal relates to publicly owned water and sewer facilities permitted to discharge and therefore would anticipate minimal fiscal impact.

Oversight assumes this proposal will have no direct fiscal impact on state or local government funds.

In response to similar legislation (HB 1058), officials from the **Department of Health and Senior Services**, the **Department of Economic Development-Division of Energy**, and the **Missouri Public Service Commission** each assumed the proposal would not fiscally impact their respective agencies.

Officials from the Cole County Public Water District #4, Franklin County Water District, Cole County Public Water District #3, and the St. Charles County Public Water Supply District #2 did not respond to Oversight's request for fiscal impact.

Senate Amendment 3

Oversight assumes Senate Amendment 3 will have no fiscal impact on community improvement districts.
