FISCAL ANALYSIS

ASSUMPTION

Oversight was unable to receive some of the agency responses in a timely manner due to the short fiscal note request time. Oversight has presented this fiscal note on the best current information that we have or on prior year information regarding a similar bill. Upon the receipt of agency responses, Oversight will review to determine if an updated fiscal note should be prepared and seek the necessary approval of the chairperson of the Joint Committee on Legislative Research to publish a new fiscal note.

Officials at the **Office of the State Courts Administrator** assume no fiscal impact from this proposal.

Officials at the **Platte County Board of Election Commission** assume no fiscal impact from this proposal.

Oversight assumes from this proposal that no person shall be found guilty of failure to appear if the criminal matter solely involves certain traffic-related infractions. By prohibiting this action, Oversight assumes there could be a reduction to the number of drivers' licenses that would be reinstated which could lead to a loss in revenue to the Department of Revenue. There could also be fewer court fees that are assessed and collected. Therefore, Oversight will reflect an unknown loss to various state funds and local political subdivisions for this fiscal note.

FISCAL DESCRIPTION

Under current law, a person commits the offense of failure to appear if such person was released pending a hearing, trial, or other stage of a criminal matter and knowingly fails to appear before the court or judicial officer as required.

This act provides that no person shall be found guilty of failure to appear if the criminal matter solely involves one or more infractions that are moving violations, violations of municipal or county traffic ordinances, or violations of state vehicle laws.

This legislation is not federally mandated, would not duplicate any other program and would not require additional capital improvements or rental space.
