Bill Summary: This proposal prohibits the use of restraints on children under the age of

17 and pregnant and post-postpartum offenders during court proceedings

except in certain circumstances.

Fiscal Analysis

Oversight was unable to receive some of the agency responses in a timely manner due to the short fiscal note request time. Oversight has presented this fiscal note on the best current information that we have or on prior year information regarding a similar bill. Upon the receipt of agency responses, Oversight will review to determine if an updated fiscal note should be prepared and seek the necessary approval of the chairperson of the Joint Committee on Legislative Research to publish a new fiscal note.

In response to similar legislation from 2015, SB 269, officials at the **Office of the Attorney General** assumed that any potential costs arising from this proposal can be absorbed with existing resources.

In response to similar legislation from 2015, SB 269, officials at the **Office of the State Courts Administrator**, the **Office of the State Public Defender** and the **Office of Prosecution Services** each assumed no fiscal impact to their respective agencies from this proposal.

Oversight assumes this proposal prohibits the use of restraints on children under the age of 17 and pregnant and post-postpartum offenders during court proceedings except in certain circumstances. Oversight assumes this is a change in policy and procedures during court proceedings and will have no direct fiscal impact.
