#### FISCAL ANALYSIS

#### **ASSUMPTION**

Officials at the **Department of Elementary and Secondary Education** assume this proposal would provide grants to support the deaf-blind community. The total amount of grants provided shall be capped at \$300,000 annually. The Missouri Commission on the Deaf and Hard of Hearing would need one FTE Supervisor to administer the request-for-proposal process, grant issuance and grant writing.

**Oversight** assumes this proposal allows grants to be issued by the Missouri Commission on Deaf and Hard of Hearing (MCDHH). The balance of the Missouri Commission Deaf & Hard of Hearing Fund (0743) as of June 30, 2015 was \$5,254 and receipts into the fund for FY 2015 totaled \$6,200. Therefore, Oversight assumes that General Revenue would need to appropriate funds to the Missouri Commission on Deaf and Hard of Hearing Fund to provide for the grants. Oversight assumes all money received by the Fund will be issued as grants. Oversight will show the impact as \$0 (no money appropriated) or \$300,000.

**Oversight** notes this proposal does not place a cap of the amount of the \$300,000 grant one organization can receive. Therefore, Oversight assumes the MCDHH could absorb the responsibilities of this grant with existing resources. Should MCDHH experience the number of request-for-proposals to justify another FTE, they could seek that FTE through the appropriation process.

## FISCAL IMPACT - Small Business

No direct fiscal impact to small businesses would be expected as a result of this proposal.

#### FISCAL DESCRIPTION

This bill specifies the Missouri Commission for the Deaf and Hard of Hearing must provide grants to organizations that provide services for deaf-blind children and their families, deaf-blind adults, and provide training for support service providers. The commission must use a request-for-proposal process to award grants. Organizations that receive a grant may use it for any purpose authorized.

This legislation is not federally mandated, would not duplicate any other program and would not require additional capital improvements or rental space.
