FISCAL ANALYSIS

ASSUMPTION

Officials from the **Department of Insurance, Financial Institutions and Professional Registration** and the **Office of the State Courts Administrator** each assume the proposal would not fiscally impact their respective agencies.

House Amendment 1

In response to this provision in SB 722, officials from the **Department of Health and Senior Services, the Department of Insurance, Financial Institutions and Professional Registration, the Department of Social Services, and the Department of Mental Health** each assumed the proposal would not fiscally impact their respective agencies.

House Amendment 3

In response to this provision in HB 1697, officials from the **Department of Health and Senior Services, the Department of Insurance, Financial Institutions and Professional Registration and the Department of Social Services, MO HealthNet Division, Missouri Medicaid Audit Compliance Unit, and Division of Legal Services** each assumed the proposal would not fiscally impact their respective agencies.

House Amendment 4 as amended by House Amendment 1 to House Amendment 4

This amendment is nearly identical to SB 985, in which Oversight received the following responses:

Officials from the **Joint Committee on Administrative Rules (JCAR)** stated the legislation is not anticipated to cause a fiscal impact to JCAR beyond its current appropriation.

Officials from the **Missouri Office of Prosecution Services, the Office of Administration, Administrative Hearing Commission and the Office of State Courts Administrator** each assumed the proposal would not fiscally impact their respective agencies.

Oversight assumes the amendment will have no fiscal impact on the state since Missouri is already a Nurse Licensure Compact member.

No direct fiscal impact to small businesses would be expected as a result of this proposal.


FISCAL DESCRIPTION
