FISCAL ANALYSIS

ASSUMPTION

Officials at the **University of Missouri System** assume no fiscal impact from this proposal. This proposal would stop cities or counties from passing their own fertilizer regulations and having the responsibility for the enforcement of those regulations on the Fertilizer Control Programs. This has happened in other states: Florida, Minnesota, New Jersey, Michigan and others and it restricts what and when fertilizers can be applied. They typically are restricting phosphorus application by home owners, agriculture is normally exempted. Florida has extensive regulation on phosphate and nitrogen applications.

Officials at the **Department of Agriculture** assume no fiscal impact from this proposal.

Officials at the Callaway County Commission, St. Louis County and the City of Kansas City each assume no fiscal impact to their respective entities from this proposal.
