FISCAL ANALYSIS

ASSUMPTION

§170.345 Missouri Civics Education Initiative

Oversight notes this proposal requires any student entering ninth grade after July 1, 2017 (FY 2018), as a condition for graduation shall pass an examination on the principles of American Civics.

Oversight notes this proposal requires the civics test given by the school districts to use similar questions to those used by the United States Citizenship and Immigration Service (USCIS). Oversight contacted the USCIS about the availability of school districts using their existing test. Oversight received a response from the USCIS that stated school districts would not be allowed to use their test for free or for a fee. Additionally, copies of the test are not allowed to be distributed to school districts. School Districts would be required to create their own tests.

Oversight will show an impact for all school districts of "Could exceed \$100,000" to create and administer this test yearly starting in FY 2018.

Officials at the **Department of Elementary and Secondary Education (DESE)** assume this proposal requires DESE to certify that a student has taken and received a passing grade on the test. Costs are significant but unknown (could exceed \$100,000). At a minimum, schools will be required to enter student scores for every graduating student. This might involve self-reporting data on a district-made assessment.

To have passing grades certified requires DESE to design a state-wide, online assessment that could be administered multiple times as needed to a student until that student scored over 60%. It would have to be an online platform where the data could dump directly into MOSIS. (significant unknown costs).

Oversight will show an impact to DESE of "Could exceed \$100,000" in FY 2017.

Officials at the **Everton School District** assume \$1,000 annually for testing.

Officials at the Kansas City Public Schools assume little to no impact to the district.

Officials at the **West Plains School District** assume there is no fiscal impact from this proposal.

FISCAL IMPACT - Small Business

No direct fiscal impact to small businesses would be expected as a result of this proposal.

FISCAL DESCRIPTION

The bill adds American Civics to the current existing prohibition on students receiving a certificate of graduation without having satisfactorily passed an examination on the provisions and principles of the United States and Missouri constitutions, American history, and American institutions.

This bill creates the Missouri Civics Education Initiative. Any student entering ninth grade after July 1, 2017, who is attending a public, charter, or private school, except for private trade schools, must, as a condition of high school graduation take and pass an American civics test similar to the civics portion of the United States Naturalization test, produced by the United States Citizenship and Immigration Services (USCIS).

The bill allows the school district to administer the test on American civics in conjunction with testing on the provisions and principles of the United States and Missouri constitutions, American history, and American institutions. The school district may use an on-line test to comply with these provisions. Each district must adopt a policy permitting a student with a disability to receive a waiver from this requirement, if recommended by the student's Individualized Education Plan (IEP) committee.

This bill also allows a school district to recognize a student's participation in the Constitution Project of the Missouri Supreme Court, as specified in the bill.

This legislation is not federally mandated, would not duplicate any other program and would not require additional capital improvements or rental space.
