FISCAL ANALYSIS

ASSUMPTION

Officials at the **Department of Elementary and Secondary Education (DESE)** assume this proposal makes changes to the funding formula. This section has the potential to be a savings in state aid. This change will result in a fiscal impact only if the formula is fully funded. This proposal changes the law to provide for a cap on the increase in state funding that is included in the calculation of the state adequacy target. This has the potential to be a cost saver for the state. The impact could exceed \$1 million.

This proposal has a provision that may not have a fiscal impact until such time as the formula is fully funded. FISCAL IMPACT - Small Business

No direct fiscal impact to small businesses would be expected as a result of this proposal.

FISCAL DESCRIPTION

This act modifies the definition of "current operating expenditures" so that, when used to recalculate the state adequacy target as provided in this section, any increase in state funding attributable to an individual district shall be limited to two hundred percent of the aggregate percentage increase in state funding for all of the performance districts used in the same recalculation.

This act contains an emergency clause.

This legislation is not federally mandated, would not duplicate any other program and would not require additional capital improvements or rental space.
