FISCAL ANALYSIS

ASSUMPTION

Section 221.407

In response to similar legislation this year, HCS for HB Nos. 2188, 1533, 1393, 2114 & 2113, officials at the **Office of Administration's Division of Budget & Planning** and the **Office of the State Auditor** each assumed no fiscal impact to their respective agencies from this proposal.

In response to similar legislation this year, HCS for HB Nos. 2188, 1533, 1393, 2114 & 2113, officials at the **State Tax Commission** assumed no fiscal impact from this proposal.

Sections 304.125 & 575.320

In response to a previous version, officials at the **City of Columbia** do not have a policy governing the number of traffic citations issued. Therefore, no fiscal impact is expected.

In response to a previous version, officials at the **City of Independence** assumed this bill will significantly impact law enforcement. Fiscal Impact is an indirect impact of this bill. Self initiated activity is a significant part of a police officer's duties and responsibilities. Writing tickets is a part of the measurement of this duty. While there are other components of measuring self-initiated activity, this has to be included as a part of performance measures.

Officials at the **City of Kansas City** state it is unknown if there will be a loss of revenue. The Kansas City Police Department (KCPD) is not controlled by the City of Kansas City. It is the City's understanding that the KCPD does not use quotas for traffic tickets. If that understanding is correct there is no impact, and the extension of the prohibition on ticket quotas to full-time traffic officers would not be a change in the KCPD's practices.

In response to a previous version, officials at **St. Louis County**, the **Cole County Sheriff's Department**, the **Columbia Police Department** and the **St. Louis County Police Department** each assumed no fiscal impact to their respective entities from this proposal.

In response to a previous version, officials at the **Callaway County Commission** assumed no fiscal impact from this proposal.

In response to a previous version, officials at the **Jackson County Sheriff's Department** stated they do not have quotas, but the administration of these changes will be difficult.

ASSUMPTION (continued)

Oversight assumes the vast majority of police departments and sheriffs departments already adhere to the proposed changes regarding ticket quotas and that the bill does not directly require law enforcement to issue more tickets or fewer tickets. The proposal may have an indirect administrative impact on local law enforcement; however, Oversight will assume no direct fiscal impact from this proposal.

In response to a previous version, officials at the **Office of the Attorney General (AGO)** assumed that any potential costs arising from this proposal can be absorbed with existing resources. The AGO may request additional appropriations if the proposal results in a significant increase in cases.

Section 610.100

In response to a previous version, officials at the **Department of Conservation** assumed the proposed legislation would have a negative fiscal impact on the Department funds more than \$100,000 annually due to the need for considerable electronic storage space.

Oversight assumes according to section 610.100 of the proposal that mobile video recordings reports are considered closed records and the Department of Conservation is not required to make these recordings. Therefore, Oversight will assume no direct fiscal impact for the Department for this proposal.

In response to a previous version, officials from the Office of the State Auditor, the Department of Public Safety - Missouri Gaming Commission, the Department of Public Safety - Division of Fire Safety, the Department of Public Safety - Missouri Veterans Commission, the Missouri Consolidated Health Care Plan, the Joint Committee on Public Employee Retirement, the Administrative Hearing Commission, the Missouri Lieutenant Governor, the Legislative Research, the Missouri State Employees Retirement System, the Missouri Lottery Commission, the Missouri Senate, the Department of Public Safety - Alcohol and Tobacco Control and the Department of Public Safety - State Emergency Management Agency each assumed the current proposal would not fiscally impact their respective agencies.

Bill as a whole

Officials at the Office of Prosecution Services, the Joint Committee on Administrative Rules, the Missouri Ethics Commission, the Office of the Secretary of State, the Department of Public Safety's Missouri Highway Patrol and the Department of Social Services each assume no fiscal impact to their respective agencies from this proposal.
