FISCAL ANALYSIS

ASSUMPTION

Officials at the **Office of the State Courts Administrator** assume the proposed legislation exempts marijuana from certain forfeiture provisions relating to controlled substances. There may be some impact, but there is no way to quantify that currently. Any significant changes will be reflected in future budget requests.

Officials at the **Department of Health and Senior Services**, the **Department of Corrections**, the **Department of Insurance**, **Financial Institutions and Professional Registration** and the **Department of Public Safety's Missouri Highway Patrol** each assume no fiscal impact to their respective agencies from this proposal.

Oversight inquired the Department of Public Safety's Missouri Highway Patrol (MHP) regarding this proposal. The MHP receives drug seizure proceeds from the FBI through the Federal Drug Seizure Fund (0194).

According to reports from the Office of the State Treasurer, the state's Federal Drug Seizure Fund had receipts of:

\$647,418 in FY 2013; \$542,993 in FY 2014; and \$472,103 in FY 2015.

The balance of the fund on January 31, 2016 was \$1,002,869. Oversight does not know how much of the federal seizure proceeds noted above were from marijuana-related arrests.

Also, the **MHP** states they received \$283,586 in drug seizure money from the Department of Justice and the Department of Treasury in 2015.

Oversight notes that the FY 2016 budget for the Department of Public Safety includes two appropriations from fund 0194 that must be in compliance with the United States Department of Justice Equitable Sharing Program guidelines:

Section 8.090 Missouri Highway Patrol: for the "Enforcement Program" expense and equipment

\$1,043,448; and

Section 8.245 Office of the Adjutant General for Missouri Military Forces Administration for expense and equipment

Oversight assumes this proposal would exempt marijuana from certain forfeiture provisions and would result in an unknown loss of Federal Funds to the MHP as well as to local political subdivisions.

FISCAL DESCRIPTION

Under current law, illegal controlled substances, anything of value exchanged for a controlled substance in violation of the law, money used to facilitate a violation of the controlled substances laws, money found in close proximity to an illegal controlled substance, and any other property used in relation to or derived from a violation of the controlled substances laws is subject to seizure and forfeiture. This act exempts marijuana from these forfeiture provisions.

This legislation is not federally mandated, would not duplicate any other program and would not require additional capital improvements or rental space.
