FISCAL ANALYSIS

ASSUMPTION

Oversight notes this proposal allows a school district to provide teen dating violence prevention education as part of the health education course and an age-appropriate curriculum to educate students about domestic violence.. If a school district chooses to offer this program then certain information must be provided. Oversight can not determine the number of schools that may already have this prevention education. Oversight assumes that since these programs are optional, the fiscal note will not reflect a fiscal impact.

Officials at the **Department of Elementary and Secondary Education** and the **Department of Health and Senior Services** each assume there is no fiscal impact from this proposal to their respective organizations.

Officials at the **Office of the Attorney General** assume that any potential costs arising from this proposal can be absorbed with existing resources.

Officials at the **Brentwood School District** assume this would cost \$384 for curriculum development.

Officials at the **Carondelet Leadership Academy** assume \$5,000 for outside consultants to provide instructions.

Officials at the **Cassville School District** assume this would have a \$7,500 fiscal impact.

Officials at the **Eldon School District** assume this would cost \$5,500.

Officials at the **Everton School District** assume this would cost \$10,000.

Officials at the **Hawthorn Leadership** assume a cost of \$2,500 per year in professional development and curriculum development.

Officials at the **Kennett** and the **Milan C-2** school districts assume this would have a negative impact that is unknown at this time.

Officials at the **Lee's Summit School District** assume this would have a substantial impact to either develop or purchase curriculum and materials to implement this program.

Officials at the **Pettis County R-XII**, **St. Elizabeth** and the **Wright City R-II** school districts each assume this would cost \$500.

Officials at the **Shell Knob School District** assume the impact is unknown at this time.

Officials at the **St. Charles School District** assume this would cost \$100,000.
