#### FISCAL ANALYSIS

#### **ASSUMPTION**

**Oversight** was unable to receive agency responses due to the short fiscal note request time for the original and corrected fiscal notes. Since the original and corrected fiscal note, Oversight has received agency responses and is providing their responses as follows:

Officials from the **Joint Committee on Administrative Rules (JCAR)** state the legislation is not anticipated to cause a fiscal impact to JCAR beyond its current appropriation.

Officials from the **Department of Health and Senior Services**, the **Office of Administration**, **Division of Purchasing and Materials Management** and **Information Technology Services Division** and the **Office of State Courts Administrator** each assume the proposal would not fiscally impact their respective agencies.

Officials from the **Office of Secretary of State (SOS)** did not respond to **Oversight's** request. However, based on similar rules language in other bills from the current session, Oversight assumes the **SOS** will not incur additional expenses beyond the core funding it receives to handle activity resulting from each year's legislative session and that any printing and distribution costs related to this proposal can be absorbed within current funding levels.
