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FISCAL ANALYSIS

ASSUMPTION

Officials from the **Attorney General's Office** assume that any potential costs arising from this proposal can be absorbed with existing resources.

Officials from the **Office of the State Courts Administrator** assume the current proposal would not fiscally impact their agency.

Officials from the **Department of Insurance, Financial Institutions and Professional Registration** state that it is unknown how many civil litigation funding companies may need to be registered. The department believes it can absorb the potential registration for a small number of entities. However, should the number of entities be greater than anticipated, or there are a large number of hearings, the department would request additional appropriation and/or FTE through the budget process.

Oversight assumes income of less than \$100,000 from applications (\$500) and renewals (\$200 every 2 years) in Section 436.570, RSMo.

This proposal may increase total state revenue.
