FISCAL ANALYSIS

ASSUMPTION

Oversight was unable to receive some of the agency responses in a timely manner due to the short fiscal note request time. Oversight has presented this fiscal note on the best current information that we have or on prior year information regarding a similar bill. Upon the receipt of agency responses, Oversight will review to determine if an updated fiscal note should be prepared and seek the necessary approval of the chairperson of the Joint Committee on Legislative Research to publish a new fiscal note.

Officials from the **Department of Insurance**, **Financial Institutions and Professional Registration** assume the current proposal would not fiscally impact their agency.

In response to a similar proposal from last session, HB 202, officials from the Missouri Consolidated Health Care Plan, the Department of Health and Senior Services, the Department of Social Services, Department of Public Safety - Missouri Highway Patrol, the Missouri Department of Conservation and the Department of Mental Health each assumed the proposal would not fiscally impact their respective agencies.
