FISCAL ANALYSIS

ASSUMPTION

Officials from the **Missouri Office of Prosecution Services (MOPS)** state the proposal will have no measurable fiscal impact to MOPS. The creation of a new crime creates additional responsibilities for county prosecutors which may in turn result in additional costs which are difficult to determine.

Oversight assumes the potential responsibilities imposed on county prosecutors as a result of this proposal, will be absorbable within current funding and staffing levels.

Officials from the **Office of Attorney General** assume any potential costs arising from this proposal can be absorbed with existing resources.

Officials from the Department of Health and Senior Services, the Department of Insurance, Financial Institutions and Professional Registration, the Department of Mental Health, the Department of Corrections, the Department of Social Services, MO HealthNet Division and the Division of Legal Services, the Office of State Courts Administrator and the Office of State Public Defender each assume the proposal would not fiscally impact their respective agencies.
