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FISCAL ANALYSIS

ASSUMPTION

Officials from the **Joint Committee on Administrative Rules** state that the proposal is not anticipated to cause a fiscal impact to their agency beyond its current appropriation.

Officials from the **Department of Transportation**, the **Department of Social Services**, the **Department of Health and Senior Services**, the **Missouri Department of Conservation**, and the **Department of Mental Health** each assume the current proposal would not fiscally impact their respective agencies.

Officials from the **Department of Insurance, Financial Institutions and Professional Registration (DIFP)** estimate at least 10 conditions are treated with step therapy based on a list published by South Carolina Blues (a BlueCross Blue Shield company) in 2015. DIFP can multiply the number of conditions treated using step therapy drugs by the number of major medical carriers and the cost of a contracted clinical review to get the total cost of contracted medical reviews.

There were 73 major medical companies and HMOs combined at the end of 2014, and the cost of each clinical review, based on past experience with similar reviews, would be at least \$5,000. Therefore, DIFP estimates the fiscal impact of these clinical reviews to be \$3,650,000 (10 medical conditions x 73 major medical insurance companies x \$5,000 medical review cost). Since the legislation does not include a funding source, DIFP assumes General Revenue will be needed.

The department estimates up to 10 amendments per licensed company in the small employer group market. At the end of 2014 there were 73 licensed major medical and health maintenance organization companies in Missouri. Policy amendments must be submitted to the department for review along with a \$50 filing fee. One time additional revenues to the Insurance Dedicated Fund are estimated to be up to \$36,500.

Additional staff and expenses are not being requested with this single proposal, but if multiple proposals pass during the legislative session which require policy form reviews the department will need to request additional staff to handle increase in workload.
