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FISCAL ANALYSIS

ASSUMPTION

Officials from the Missouri Consolidated Health Care Plan, the Department of Health and Senior Services, the Office of the Secretary of State, the Department of Transportation, the Missouri Department of Conservation, the Department of Mental Health and the Department of Social Services each assume the current proposal would not fiscally impact their respective agencies.

Officials from the **Joint Committee on Administrative Rules** state that the proposal is not anticipated to cause a fiscal impact to their agency beyond its current appropriation.

Officials from the **Department of Insurance, Financial Institutions and Professional Registration (DIFP)** estimate up to 10 amendments per licensed company in the small employer group market. At the end of 2014 there were 73 licensed major medical and health maintenance organization companies in Missouri. Policy amendments must be submitted to the department for review along with a \$50 filing fee. One time additional revenues to the Insurance Dedicated Fund are estimated to be up to \$36,500.

Oversight assumes this proposal will only apply to policies delivered, issued or renewed on or after January 1, 2018. Therefore, Oversight will move the fiscal impact to FY 2018 and reflect "Up to" DIFP's estimate.
