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FISCAL ANALYSIS

ASSUMPTION

Oversight was unable to receive some of the agency responses in a timely manner due to the short fiscal note request time. Oversight has presented this fiscal note on the best current information that we have or on prior year information regarding a similar bill. Upon the receipt of agency responses, Oversight will review to determine if an updated fiscal note should be prepared and seek the necessary approval of the chairperson of the Joint Committee on Legislative Research to publish a new fiscal note.

Officials from the **Office of Prosecution Services** and the **Office of the State Public Defender** each assume no fiscal impact from this proposal.

Officials from the **Cole County Sheriff's Office** state there is a long-term significant fiscal impact to sheriffs.

Oversight notes that currently, an application for a permit to carry a concealed weapon is \$100, and a renewal (after 5 years) fee is \$50 (\$571.101.11 and .12). This proposal would create a lifetime concealed carry permit with an application fee of \$200 (\$10 to replace a lost or stolen permit, \$50 to reactivate a lifetime permit, and \$10 to correct because of a change in name).

In response to a different bill this session, SB 656, officials from the **Department of Public Safety - Missouri Highway Patrol** stated over the past five years, 214,297 state and federal fingerprint based criminal background checks have been processed for CCW permits which is an average of 42,859 requests per year (214,297 / 5).

Oversight does not know how many of the current or future concealed carry permit holders would opt to get a lifetime permit. Oversight assumes those who currently have a permit that would choose to get a lifetime permit at their next renewal, would pay a \$200 application fee instead of the current \$50 renewal fee. In this scenario, the sheriff's department would temporarily see additional moneys coming into their Revolving Fund. However, if the applicant would have paid \$50 to renew their license many times going forward (without passage of this bill), the sheriff's office now would not receive the \$50 every five years, and eventually, their Revolving Fund would lose proceeds. Therefore, within the scope of this fiscal note (3 years), Oversight will reflect an unknown amount of additional permit fees being paid into the counties' Sheriff Revolving Funds for those who opt to obtain a lifetime permit (\$200) instead of the current five year permit (\$100) or the current five year renewal (\$50).

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ASSUMPTION (continued)

Oversight will assume this proposal also may eventually have an impact on the Missouri Highway Patrol for processing fewer background checks, but that too would be outside the scope of this fiscal note.

FISCAL IMPACT - Small Business

No direct fiscal impact to small businesses would be expected as a result of this proposal.

FISCAL DESCRIPTION

Under current law, concealed carry permits must be renewed once every five years. This act allows a Missouri resident who meets the requirements for a concealed carry permit and pays a \$200 fee to receive a concealed carry permit that lasts for the duration of the person's life. Such a permit does not need to be renewed every five years and is valid throughout the state of Missouri.

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FISCAL DESCRIPTION (continued)

The lifetime permit is still subject to the same suspension and revocation provisions that apply to permits that expire. Instead of an expiration date, a lifetime concealed carry permit must include a statement that the permit is valid only throughout the state of Missouri.

If the holder of a lifetime concealed carry permit becomes a resident of another state, the permit is suspended. It may be reactivated if the permit holder reestablishes Missouri residency, meets the requirements for a concealed carry permit, pays a \$50 fee, and passes a name-based criminal background check.

This legislation is not federally mandated, would not duplicate any other program and would not require additional capital improvements or rental space.
