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#### FISCAL ANALYSIS

#### **ASSUMPTION**

Officials from the Department of Health and Senior Services, the Missouri Department of Conservation, the Missouri Consolidated Health Care Plan, the Department of Mental Health, the Department of Transportation, and the Department of Social Services each assume the current proposal would not fiscally impact their respective agencies.

Officials from the **Department of Public Safety - Missouri Highway Patrol** defer to Department of Transportation for fiscal impact from this proposal.

Officials from the **Department of Insurance, Financial Institutions and Professional Registration (DIFP)** expects any plan with a pharmacy benefit to file amendments. DIFP expects that major medical plans will be impacted the most by this proposal. DIFP assumes there will be approximately 430 policy amendments. Policy amendments must be submitted to the department for review along with a \$50 filing fee or \$21,500.

Additional staff and expenses are not being requested with this single proposal, but if multiple proposals pass during the legislative session which require policy form reviews the department will need to request additional staff to handle the increase in workload.

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#### FISCAL IMPACT - Small Business

#### FISCAL DESCRIPTION

This proposal requires an enrollee in an HMO or health insurance plan to pay only the usual and customary retail price of a prescription drug if the co-payment applied by an HMO or health insurer exceeds the usual and customary retail price and there shall be no further charge to the enrollee or plan sponsor for the prescription.

This legislation is not federally mandated, would not duplicate any other program and would not require additional capital improvements or rental space.
