ASSUMPTION

#Due to time constraints, **Oversight** originally prepared a fiscal note for this bill without all of the agency responses. Oversight has since obtained the agency responses and upon review of those responses, believes the original fiscal note should be updated. Therefore, this fiscal note updates the original by providing agency responses.

#For the purpose of this proposed legislation, officials at the **Office of State Public Defender** (**SPD**) cannot assume that existing staff will provide effective representation for any new cases arising where indigent persons are charged with the proposed new crime of terrorism, a new Class A Felony. While the number of new cases may be too few or uncertain to request additional funding for this specific bill, the SPD will continue to request sufficient appropriations to provide effective representation.

#Oversight assumes the SPD can absorb the additional caseload that may result from this proposal.

#Officials at the **Office of the Attorney General (AGO)** assume that any potential costs arising from this proposal can be absorbed with existing resources. The AGO may seek additional appropriations if the proposal results in a significant increase in cases.

#Officials at the **Office of the State Courts Administrator**, the **Office of the Governor**, the **Department of Corrections** and the **Office of Prosecution Services** each assume no fiscal impact to their respective agencies from this proposal.
