## FISCAL ANALYSIS

### ASSUMPTION

**Oversight** was unable to receive some of the agency responses in a timely manner due to the short fiscal note request time. Oversight has presented this fiscal note on the best current information that we have or on prior year information regarding a similar bill. Upon the receipt of agency responses, Oversight will review to determine if an updated fiscal note should be prepared and seek the necessary approval of the chairperson of the Joint Committee on Legislative Research to publish a new fiscal note.

**Oversight** notes this proposal makes changes to the Missouri Returning Heroes' Education Act (Act). The Act requires that the public higher education institutions in this state limit the amount of tuition that is paid by combat veterans to \$50 per credit hour. Currently the tuition limitations are applied after all other federal and state aid is applied and no veteran can receive more aid than the actual cost of attendance. Oversight notes this proposal would apply the tuition limitation before other aid is calculated. Additionally, this proposal removes the restriction that total aid received can't be greater than actual tuition.

**Oversight** requested from the Department of Higher Education the amount of tuition and number of students whose tuition has been waived in the past under this program. The Department stated they do not routinely gather this information. The last time they asked the institutions for this information was 2011. At that time the institutions reported the one year tuition waiver listed below:

**Oversight** will show the loss of tuition to the institutions as Unknown greater than \$100,000.

Officials at the **Department of Higher Education** assume there is no fiscal impact from this proposal to the agency.

Officials at the **University of Central Missouri** assume they are already doing this so there would be no fiscal impact.

ASSUMPTION (continued)

Officials at the **Metropolitan Community College** assume that in 2013-2015 the College waived \$23,021 in tuition for veterans.

Officials at the **State Fair Community College** assume they have waived the following tuition amounts for veterans:

FY 2013	7 students = \$7,646
FY 2014	7 students = \$6,797
FY 2015	5 students = \$4,670
FY 2016	5 students = \$2,910 so far

Officials at the **Missouri State University** assume this would result in a negative impact on the University of \$70,000 to \$140,000 per year. (In addition to the current University program costs of \$70,000 per year.)

In response to similar legislation filed this year, HB 2156, officials at the **State Technical College of Missouri** assume this will have an unknown negative impact on the College.

In response to similar legislation filed this year, HB 2156, officials at the **Missouri Western State University** assumed a loss of \$25,000 annually.

Officials at the **St. Louis Community College** assume they have waived over \$30,400 for 90 students.

In response to similar legislation filed this year, HB 2156, officials at the **University of Missouri** assumed the approximate annual loss to the Columbia campus would be \$250,000. This assumes the number of students remain consistent at 45 current students. The St. Louis campus has 36 students but this would not impact them. The Kansas City campus assumes this may encourage more students to attend. The Science and Technology campus assumes this would be a loss of \$34,650.

FISCAL DESCRIPTION

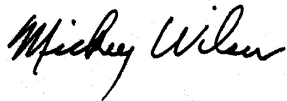
Currently, the tuition limitation authorized by the Missouri Returning Heroes' Education Act is applied after all other federal and state aid for which the veteran is eligible has been applied. This act applies the tuition limitation before all other aid.

This act also repeals a provision that limits the amount of aid a veteran shall receive to the actual cost of attendance.

This legislation is not federally mandated, would not duplicate any other program and would not require additional capital improvements or rental space.
