FISCAL ANALYSIS

ASSUMPTION

Oversight was unable to receive some of the agency responses in a timely manner due to the short fiscal note request time. Oversight has presented this fiscal note on the best current information that we have or on prior year information regarding a similar bill. Upon the receipt of agency responses, Oversight will review to determine if an updated fiscal note should be prepared and seek the necessary approval of the chairperson of the Joint Committee on Legislative Research to publish a new fiscal note.

Officials from the **Office of Prosecution Services** and the **Office of the State Public Defender** each assume the proposal would not fiscally impact their respective agencies.

Based upon the few responses that we have received, as well as the summary of the bill ("makes minor grammatical changes to the criminal code revision, which takes effect January 1, 2017"), **Oversight** will assume the proposal will not have a fiscal impact.
