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FISCAL ANALYSIS

ASSUMPTION

Oversight was unable to receive some of the agency responses in a timely manner due to the short fiscal note request time. Oversight has presented this fiscal note on the best current information that we have or on prior year information regarding a similar bill. Upon the receipt of agency responses, Oversight will review to determine if an updated fiscal note should be prepared and seek the necessary approval of the chairperson of the Joint Committee on Legislative Research to publish a new fiscal note.

Officials from the Missouri Consolidated Health Care Plan, the Administrative Hearing Commission, the Missouri State Employees Retirement System, the Department of Public Safety, the Department of Economic Development, the Legislative Research, the Missouri Lottery Commission, the Department of Revenue, the Department of Higher Education, the MoDOT and Patrol Employees Retirement System, the Office of the State Courts Administrator, the Office of Administration, the Office of the State Treasurer, the Joint Committee on Administrative Rules, the Department of Natural Resources, the Department of Agriculture, the Office of the Governor, the Office of Prosecution Services, the Missouri Ethics Commission, the State Tax Commission, the Joint Committee on Public Employee Retirement, the Department of Corrections, and the Department of Elementary and Secondary Education each assume the current proposal would not fiscally impact their respective agencies.

Officials from the **Office of the State Public Defender (SPD)** state video recording relating to public defender cases must be viewed by the accused's attorney. Video recordings create large demands on SPD's limited IT resources. As more video recordings become available, the more SPD's network is disrupted for download of large video files.

In response to a similar proposal, HB 2344, officials from the **Office of Administration - Budget and Planning** stated that currently, RSMo 610.026.1(1) allows public agencies, when fulfilling records requests, to charge fees for research time. This proposal specifies that research time includes time spent reviewing records to determine whether they are closed or are authorized to be closed. This could impact state agencies fulfilling such requests. This may increase Total State Revenue by an unknown amount and could impact the calculation under Article X, Section 18(e).

Oversight assumes this proposal may impact local law enforcement agencies in a similar manner as stated above by Office of Administration - Budget and Planning. For fiscal note purposes, Oversight will show an unknown positive impact to these agencies.

This proposal could increase Total State Revenue.

Officials from the **Missouri Department of Conservation** assume an unknown negative fiscal impact from this proposal.

FISCAL IMPACT - Small Business

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FISCAL DESCRIPTION

This proposal modifies provisions relating to the Sunshine Law. Currently, allowable fees for providing public records includes research time for fulfilling requests. This proposal includes time spent reviewing records to determine whether or not the records are closed or authorized to be closed. A public body may waive or reduce fees if such waiver or reduction is in the public interest because the applicable fees are minimal and should be waived for administrative efficiency. Payment of copying, search, research and duplication fees may be requested prior to the making of copies or production of records.

This legislation is not federally mandated, would not duplicate any other program and would not require additional capital improvements or rental space.
