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#### FISCAL ANALYSIS

#### **ASSUMPTION**

**Oversight** was unable to receive some of the agency responses in a timely manner due to the short fiscal note request time. Oversight has presented this fiscal note on the best current information that we have or on prior year information regarding a similar bill. Upon the receipt of agency responses, Oversight will review to determine if an updated fiscal note should be prepared and seek the necessary approval of the chairperson of the Joint Committee on Legislative Research to publish a new fiscal note.

Officials from the **Department of Revenue** and **Department of Economic Development** each assume the proposal will have no fiscal impact on their respective organizations.

In response to a similar proposal from 2016 (HB 1449), officials from the **Department of Public Safety - Missouri Highway Patrol (MHP)** assumed the proposal would have no fiscal impact on their organization. MHP issued 483 citations in 2014 for violations of the "Move Over" law. The fine amount varies by county but is typically \$150 or greater.

In response to a similar proposal from 2016 (HB 1449), officials from the **Department of Transportation** assumed the proposal would have no fiscal impact on their organization.

**Oversight** assumes there could be an increase in citations issued by adding any stationary utility vehicle to the list of vehicles covered under the "Move Over" law, therefore Oversight will reflect an Unknown fiscal impact to local political subdivisions to account for the increase in fine revenue.

### FISCAL IMPACT - Small Business

### FISCAL DESCRIPTION

This proposal adds stationary vehicles operated by a utility worker displaying lighted amber or amber and white lights to the laws requiring motor vehicle operators to proceed with caution and yield the right of way or reduce speed upon approaching the lighted vehicle.

This legislation is not federally mandated, would not duplicate any other program and would not require additional capital improvements or rental space.
