FISCAL IMPACT - Small Business

There could be a direct fiscal impact to small businesses as a result of this proposal.

FISCAL DESCRIPTION

§571.069

This bill makes a business that posts signs prohibiting concealed firearms liable for injuries or damages sustained by individuals, who would otherwise be authorized to carry firearms, while on the premises of that business. By posting signs prohibiting firearms the business would assume a duty to defend its customers. The business would be held responsible for the intention or reckless conduct of third parties, including trespasser and wild or vicious animals. The bill authorizes the injured individual to sue the business and if successful, recover attorneys' fees, expert witness costs, and court costs.

This legislation is not federally mandated, would not duplicate any other program and would not require additional capital improvements or rental space.
