ASSUMPTION

§9.154 Show Me Compassionate Medical Education Day

Officials at the **Department of Mental Health** assume there is no fiscal impact from this proposal.

§173.1200 Suicide Prevention Programs

Officials at the **Department of Higher Education** assume this would require the Department to post free-of-cost prevention materials or programs on its website. The Department can do this with existing resources.

Officials at the **Metropolitan Community College** assume a cost of \$80,000. This includes the use of current personnel, new materials, outside agencies, response to crisis, and crisis awareness.

Officials at the Missouri State University, Missouri Western State University, State Technical College of Missouri, University of Central Missouri and the University of Missouri each assume there is no fiscal impact from this proposal.

Oversight notes this proposal requires the public institutions of higher education to provide information to all incoming students about depression and suicide prevention. Oversight assumes this information can be added with no cost to the information already provided to students.

§191.594 and §191.596, Show Me Compassionate Medical Education Research Project Officials at the **Department of Higher Education** assume this may also impact some private institutions of higher education.

Officials at the **University of Missouri** assume there is no fiscal impact from this proposal.

Oversight notes this proposal creates the Show-Me Compassionate Medical Education Act that allows medical schools in Missouri to conduct a single center or multi-center study to facilitate the collection of data to minimize stress and reduce the risk of depression and suicide for medical students. Oversight did not receive a response from Truman State University. The University of Missouri and Truman State University have public medical schools that may be impacted by the proposal. Oversight assumes this allows them to conduct a study but does not require it. Oversight assumes this would not have a fiscal impact.
