FISCAL ANALYSIS

ASSUMPTION

Officials at the **Department of Public Safety's Director's Office**, the **Office of the Secretary of State** and the **Department of Revenue** each assume no fiscal impact to their respective agencies from this proposal.

Officials from the City of Jackson did not respond to **Oversight's** request for fiscal impact.

Oversight assumes this proposal is enabling legislation and would have no fiscal impact unless the governing body would request the voters of their city to approve the imposition of a sales tax. Should the voters approve the imposition of a sales tax, the city could expect revenue to be generated and there would be costs for improving the public safety of the city. Oversight assumes the Department of Revenue would collect the sales tax and retain a 1% collection fee which would be deposited into the State's General Revenue Fund.

According to information found on the Tax and Fee Distribution Summary from the Department of Revenue's Financial and Statistical Report for fiscal year ending June 30, 2015, the City of Jackson received local sales tax of \$4,364,016 (2% for city). Previous years for local sales tax for the City of Jackson were \$4,087,896 in FY 2014 and \$3,599,813 in FY 2013. Using the local sales tax of \$4,364,016 and dividing by 2% (city sales tax rate) would yield a sales base of \$218,200,800. Then multiplying the additional ½% would yield up to \$1,100,000 in new tax revenue for the City of Jackson annually. Therefore, **Oversight** will assume \$0 (not approved) or up to \$1,100,000 for a fiscal impact for this proposal. Oversight also assumes a municipal election in April 2018. If the new tax rate for the City of Jackson is approved by the majority of voters, the additional tax would begin October 1, 2018 (FY 2019).
