FISCAL ANALYSIS

ASSUMPTION

Officials at the **Office of the Secretary of State (SOS)** assume this bill would expand a program, housed under the SOS that would require additional staffing and support. This program would model the existing address confidentiality program currently housed under the Secretary of State Business Services Division. This program's current expenses were used to estimate this expansion program.

The program serves approximately 750 households with 1,475 individuals. Current program costs average about \$100.00 per year per individual (\$67.50 for PS and \$32.50 for E&E). 2 FTE are used to operate the program currently.

Fiscal impact was based on the following assumptions

<u>ASSUMPTION</u> (continued)

Additional staff needs for the expanded program would be 2 program specialist FTEs, 4 technician FTEs and 1 administrative aide/technician FTE, based on the current ratio of 1 staff member to approximately 750 individuals.

Additionally, to handle the volume of mail, there would be a purchase of 1 mailing machine in FY18, as well as ongoing E&E expenses. Currently, administration of the Safe at Home program costs approximately \$32.50 per participant for E&E.

In summary, an additional 7 FTE would be needed along with the following costs:

FY18

PS & Fringes - \$271,023 E&E - \$153,871

FY19

PS & Fringes - \$327,758 E&E - \$168,528

FY20

PS & Fringes - \$330,314 E&E - \$172,741

Officials at the Office of the State Courts Administrator, the Department of Mental Health, the Department of Corrections, the Department of Social Services, the Department of Revenue, the Office of the State Public Defender and the Office of Prosecution Services each assume no fiscal impact to their respective agencies from this proposal.

FISCAL DESCRIPTION

This act modifies provisions relating to the competence of certain persons to testify at trial, and the testimony on which court findings will be made at preliminary hearings. The act expands the circumstances in which statements made by children or vulnerable persons, which would otherwise be inadmissible to prove the truth of the matter asserted by the statements, may be so admitted. The act also adds certain persons receiving care for mental health to the list of vulnerable persons, and adds vulnerable persons to certain exceptions relating to witness testimony.

The act requires that criminal courts issue certain orders, which had previously been issued on a discretionary basis, relating to witness intimidation. These orders are required, rather than discretionary, in every case involving a child victim or offenses under certain chapters. The courts retain the discretion to issue such orders in cases in which they are not required to, and to place additional conditions on such orders including, but not limited, to those conditions listed in the act. The act creates new provisions relating to the disclosure of certain personal information relating to alleged victims of crime and to witnesses which the state intends to call in the course of criminal prosecutions. The act makes victims and witnesses eligible for participation in the Address Confidentiality Program, which is a program by which certain persons may use a designated address rather than their actual living address for mailing purposes.

This legislation is not federally mandated, would not duplicate any other program and would not require additional capital improvements or rental space.
