FISCAL ANALYSIS

ASSUMPTION

For the purpose of this proposed legislation, officials at the **Office of State Public Defender** (**SPD**) cannot assume that existing staff will provide effective representation for any indigent clients faced with the enhanced penalties for specific methods of disturbing the peace - new Class A misdemeanors.

While the number of new cases may be too few or uncertain to request additional funding for this specific bill, the SPD will continue to request sufficient appropriations to provide effective representation.

Oversight assumes the SPD can absorb the additional caseload that may result from this proposal.

Officials at the **Office of the State Courts Administrator** assume there may be some impact but there is no way to quantify that currently. Any significant changes will be reflected in future budget requests.

Officials at the **Office of the Attorney General (AGO)** assume that any potential costs arising from this proposal can be absorbed with existing resources. The AGO may seek additional appropriations if there is a significant increase in litigation.

Officials at the **Department of Public Safety's Missouri Highway Patrol**, the **Missouri Department of Transportation**, the **Department of Corrections** and the **Office of Prosecution Services** each assume no fiscal impact to their respective agencies from this proposal.

Officials at the Boone County Sheriff's Department, the Springfield Police Department, the Joplin Police Department, the Branson Police Department and the St. Louis County Department of Justice Services each assume no fiscal impact to their respective entities from this proposal.

Officials from the following **law enforcement agencies**: the Ashland Police Chief, Buchanan County Sheriff's Department, Cass County Sheriff's Office, Clark County Sheriff's Department, Clay County Sheriff's Department, Columbia Police Department, Franklin County Sheriff's Department, Greene County Sheriff's Department, Independence Police Department, Jackson County Sheriff's Department, Jasper County Sheriff's Department, Jefferson City Police Department, Jefferson County Sheriff's Department, Lawrence County Sheriff's Department, Platte County Sheriff's Department, St. Charles Police

Officials from the following **fire protection districts**: Battlefield Fire Protection District, Central County Fire and Rescue, Centralia Fire Department, Creve Coeur Fire District, DeSoto Rural Fire Protection District, Eureka Fire Protection, Hawk Point Fire Protection District, Hillsboro Fire Protection District, Jefferson County 911 Dispatch, Lake St. Louis Fire District, Mehlville Fire District, Nixa Fire Protection District, Saline Valley Fire Protection District, Southern Iron County Fire Protection District, and St. Charles County Dispatch and Alarm did not respond to **Oversight's** request for a statement of fiscal impact.
