#### FISCAL ANALYSIS

#### **ASSUMPTION**

Officials from the **Department of Public Safety - Missouri Highway Patrol**, the **Department of Mental Health**, the **Department of Corrections**, and the **Office of the State Courts Administrator** each assume the proposal would not fiscally impact their respective agencies.

Officials from the **Office of Prosecution Services (OPS)** assume the proposal would not have a measurable fiscal impact on their agency. The creation of a new crime creates additional responsibilities for county prosecutors which may, in turn, result in additional costs which are difficult to determine.

For the purpose of this proposed legislation, officials from the **Office of State Public Defender** (**SPD**) cannot assume that existing staff will provide effective representation for any new cases arising where indigent persons, who have previously been found guilty of delineated offenses against a minor, are charged with the proposed new crime of residing within 1,000 feet of a former victim, a new Class A misdemeanor.

While the number of new cases (or cases with increased penalties) may be too few or uncertain to request additional funding for this specific bill, the SPD will continue to request sufficient appropriations to provide effective representation in all cases where the right to counsel attaches.

**Oversight** assumes the SPD can absorb the additional caseload that may result from this proposal.

Officials from the **Jasper County Sheriff's Department** assume the proposal would not fiscally impact their agency.

Officials from the Clark County Sheriff's Department, the Clay County Sheriff's Department, the Cole County Sheriff's Department, and the Jackson County Sheriff's did not respond to **Oversight** request for fiscal impact.
