#### FISCAL ANALYSIS

#### **ASSUMPTION**

Officials at the **Department of Revenue (DOR)** assume to implement the proposed legislation, the DOR will be required to:

- Update procedures, forms, and the DOR website;
- Update the Dealer Licensing Manual;
- Complete programming and user acceptance testing; and
- Train Staff

The DOR would require an additional \$6,089 for additional hours paid to the following staff:

#### FY 2019 - Motor Vehicle Bureau

- Management Analysis Specialist I 200 hours @ \$18.42 = \$3,684
- Administrative Office Support Asst. 15 hours @ \$13.78 = \$ 207
- Revenue Manager Band I 80 hours @ \$25.05 = \$2,004
  - Total \$5,895
- FY 2019 Personnel Service Bureau
- Administrative Analyst III 10 hours @ \$19.43 = \$ 194

The DOR would also require ITSD staff to add new fields to the DMVC to show results for background checks. This would require 71.28 hours at \$75 per hour for a total of \$5,346.

In summary, the DOR assumes a cost of \$11,435 from General Revenue for this proposal.

**Oversight** assumes the DOR is provided with core funding to handle a certain amount of computer programming activity and additional workload expenses each year. Oversight assumes DOR could absorb the additional workload and programming costs related to this proposal.

Officials at the **Department of Elementary and Secondary Education** assume no fiscal impact from this proposal. However, if an individual holds a court-issued certificate, the state board would be prevented from denying an application or disciplining a certificate.

Officials at the **Office of the State Courts Administrator** assume there may be some impact but there is no way to quantify that currently. Any significant changes will be reflected in future budget requests.

Officials at the Missouri Department of Transportation, the Office of Administration's Division of Personnel and the Administrative Hearing Commission, the Department of Conservation, the Department of Labor and Industrial Relations, the Department of Health and Senior Services, the Department of Public Safety's Office of the Director, the Department of Insurance, Financial Institutions and Professional Registration and the Department of Corrections each assume no fiscal impact to their respective agencies from this proposal.
