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FISCAL ANALYSIS

ASSUMPTION

Officials from the **Department of Transportation (MoDOT)** assume this proposal will have no fiscal impact on their organization. The proposal does not specifically state what the repayment source or fund would be. MoDOT states there is not enough information to calculate an estimate of issuance costs or other costs at this time.

Officials from the **Office of Administration - Budget and Planning (B&P)** assume there will be no fiscal impact from this proposal. B&P defers to MoDOT for a fiscal impact estimate (issuance costs and possible repayment costs) and which fund will pay the indebtedness.

Officials from the **Department of Revenue** assume the proposal will have no fiscal impact on their organization.

Officials from St. Charles County did not respond to Oversight's request for fiscal impact.

Oversight assumes that up to \$65 million in the form of bonds or other evidence of indebtedness will be deposited into the State Road Fund for the purpose of locating, relocating, establishing, acquiring, reimbursing for, constructing, improving and maintaining state highways in St. Charles County.

Oversight will assume a bond sale of \$65,000,000 in FY 2020, with terms of 15 years (bill says between 10 years and 20 years) at a rate of 3.5% (according to OA, the last bond sale (September 2017) was at a rate of 2.38% while a bond sale by the Missouri Development Finance Board for the Fulton State Hospital in 2016 was for interest rates between 4% and 5%). Therefore, the debt service for these parameters is approximately \$5.7 million per year. Oversight will assume the debt service will be from the State Road Fund.

In response to HJR 61 (issuance of \$63 million in bonds for Veterans' Homes), the Office of Administration assumed additonal cost of \$250,000 for bond issuance fees as well as \$70,000 for rating agency fees. Oversight will assume MoDOT would incur these costs as well.

FISCAL IMPACT - Small Business

FISCAL DESCRIPTION

This act allows the Highways and Transportation Commission to issue up to \$65 million in bonds for the engineering and construction of transportation infrastructure projects in St. Charles County that meet certain criteria.

This legislation is not federally mandated, would not duplicate any other program and would not require additional capital improvements or rental space.
