FISCAL ANALYSIS

ASSUMPTION

Officials from the **Department of Insurance**, Financial Institutions and Professional Registration, Department of Elementary and Secondary Education, Office of the Governor, Office of the State Courts Administrator, Missouri Senate and Office of the State Treasurer assume the proposal will have no fiscal impact on their organizations.

Officials from the **Office of the Attorney General (AGO)** assume that any potential costs arising from this proposal can be absorbed with exiting resources. The AGO may seek additional appropriations if there is a significant increase in litigation.

§26.305

Oversight assumes this provision requires the governor to notify the senate if an appointment to any state board or commission is made when the general assembly is not in session. Oversight assumes this proposal prohibits the governor from withdrawing or rescinding an appointment once an appointment has been made and the senate has been notified.

§161.032

Oversight assumes this provision limits the number of members serving on the state board of education classified as independent to no more than two members serving at the same time.

§161.082

Oversight assumes this provision requires five members of the state board of education to have received the advice and consent of the senate to constitute a quorum. Oversight assumes this provision authorizes the state treasurer to distribute all necessary appropriations to school districts if a quorum of the state board of education has not received the advice and consent of the senate.

Oversight assumes this proposal repeals a provision authorizing the governor to make a temporary appointment to the state board of education if a vacancy arises when the General Assembly is not is session.
