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#### FISCAL ANALYSIS

#### **ASSUMPTION**

Officials from the Department of Economic Development (Public Service Commission, Office of Public Counsel and Division of Energy) the Department of Transportation, the Office of the State Courts Administrator and the Metropolitan St. Louis Sewer District each assume the proposal will have no fiscal impact on their respective organizations.

Officials from the **Attorney General's Office (AGO)** assume any potential cost arising from this proposal can be absorbed with existing resources. AGO may seek additional appropriations if the proposal results in a significant increase in cases.

**Oversight** assumes this proposal changes the penalty for any person who violates certain underground safety standards from up to \$10,000 to up to \$50,000. According to the Attorney General's Office (AGO), in 2017 there were 136 complaints received and investigated by the AGO resulting in \$30,750 in penalties fees. Secured penalties from One Call cases are distributed annually to the schools in Missouri.

**Oversight** assumes this proposal will result in an increase in revenue and will reflect an unknown income to local school districts.
