FISCAL ANALYSIS

ASSUMPTION

In response to a similar proposal from 2017 (SB 468), officials from the **Office of the Secretary of State (SOS)** assumed this proposal would require the SOS develop new information for the SOS page for emergency rules to list emergency rules filed as soon as practicable and develop an email notification process to notify anyone who signs up to be notified of such rules. SOS would also now publish fiscal notes for emergency rules along with the emergency rule. We estimate that this change would result in an additional 160 pages being printed in the Missouri Register at a cost of \$23 per page. IT SOS development cost of \$16,712 to rebuild the e-mail notification system will also be required.

Oversight assumes SOS is provided with core funding to handle a certain amount of activity each year. Oversight assumes SOS could absorb some of the costs related to this proposal; therefore, Oversight will reflect a fiscal impact of \$16,712 for IT services in FY 2019.

Officials from the **Joint Committee on Administrative Rules** assume the change to section 536.025.9 to make an emergency rule be effective not less than 10 days after the secretary of state complies with the provisions of subdivisions (2) and (3) of subsection 3 will make the date the emergency rule becomes effective uncertain. The Secretary of State is required to perform those provisions as soon as practicable. It may result in an unintended gap between the emergency rule expiration and the effective date of the proposed rule even if they are filed at the same time.

This legislation is not anticipated to cause a fiscal impact to the Joint Committee on Administrative Rules beyond its current appropriation.

and the **State Tax Commission** each assume the proposal will have no fiscal impact on their respective organizations.

In response to a similar proposal from last year (SB 468), officials from the **Department of Revenue**, **Department of Higher Education**, **Office of the State Courts Administrator**, **Department of Public Safety - Missouri Highway Patrol**, **Office of Administration - Administrative Hearing Commission**, **Office of the Governor**, **Missouri House of Representatives**, **Missouri Department of Conservation** and **Office of the Lieutenant Governor** each assumed the proposal will have no fiscal impact on their respective organizations.

FISCAL IMPACT - Small Business

FISCAL DESCRIPTION

This act requires any state agency that promulgates an emergency rule to complete a fiscal note if such rule would require an expenditure of public funds or an expenditure by a private entity. Such fiscal note shall be filed with the Secretary of State and the Joint Committee on Administrative Rules prior to the adoption of the rule.

FISCAL DESCRIPTION (continued)

As soon as practicable after an agency files an emergency rule, the Secretary of State shall publish certain materials related to the rule in the Missouri Register, email such materials to persons who have registered to be notified of the agency's actions, and publish such materials on the Secretary of State's website.

This legislation is not federally mandated, would not duplicate any other program and would not require additional capital improvements or rental space.
