FISCAL ANALYSIS

ASSUMPTION

§§210.1014 and 210.1016 - Amber Alert System/Hailey's Law

Oversight notes that the **Department of Health and Senior Services** and **Department of Public Safety - Missouri State Highway Patrol (MHP)** have stated the proposal would not have a direct fiscal impact on their organizations. The MHP states the Amber Alert is already built into the Missouri Uniform Law Enforcement System (MULES). The MHP is currently working on enhancing a system interface that a law-enforcement agency utilizing the Regional Justice Information Service (REJIS) would be able to use to request an Amber Alert directly from the REJIS system. Therefore, given this work is already underway, the MHP assumes no additional work will be required at the state level to comply with this bill.

Oversight does not have any information to the contrary. Therefore, Oversight will reflect a zero impact in the fiscal note for these agencies.

Officials from the **Department of Public Safety - Office of the Director** defer to the response from the MHP since the systems in this proposal are housed there.

FISCAL DESCRIPTION


The proposed legislation appears to have no direct fiscal impact.
