FISCAL ANALYSIS

ASSUMPTION

Section 376.421

Officials from the **Department of Insurance, Financial Institutions and Professional Registration (DIFP)** state that for the purposes of this fiscal note, it is assumed that approximately 50% of the 397 insurers licensed in Missouri will offer association health coverage. It also assumed that each of those 198 companies will submit one filing at \$150 per filing.

Additional revenues to the Insurance Dedicated Fund are estimated to be up to \$29,700 (198*\$150 = \$29,700).

Additional staff and expenses are not being requested with this single proposal, but if multiple proposals pass during the legislative session which require policy form reviews the department may need to request additional staff to handle increase in workload.

Oversight notes that the DIFP has stated the proposal would not have a direct fiscal impact on their organization. Oversight does not have any information to the contrary. Therefore, Oversight will reflect a revenue to the Insurance Dedicated Fund of \$29,700 in FY 2020 and no additional cost to the DIFP on the fiscal note.

Officials from the Missouri Consolidated Health Care Plan, the Department of Transportation and the Missouri Department of Conservation each assume the proposal will have no fiscal impact on their respective organizations.

Oversight notes that the above mentioned agencies have stated the proposal would not have a direct fiscal impact on their organization. Oversight does not have any information to the contrary. Therefore, Oversight will reflect a zero impact on the fiscal note for these agencies.

Officials from the **Office of Administration** defer to the Missouri Consolidated Health Care Plan to estimate the fiscal impact of the proposed legislation on their respective organization.
