ASSUMPTION

§311.198 - Extends a sunset on portable refrigeration units

In response to a previous version, officials from the **Department of Public Safety - Alcohol and Tobacco Control** assumed the proposal will have no fiscal impact on their organization.

Oversight notes that the **Department of Public Safety - Alcohol and Tobacco Control** has stated the proposal would not have a direct fiscal impact on their organization. Oversight does not have any information to the contrary. Therefore, Oversight will reflect a zero impact on the fiscal note.

§311.300 - Allows persons at least 18 to unload vehicles and transfer liquor into retail premises

In response to a similar proposal from this year (SB 329), officials from the **Department of Public Safety - Alcohol and Tobacco Control** assumed the proposal will have no fiscal impact on their organization.

Oversight notes that the **Department of Public Safety - Alcohol and Tobacco Control** has stated the proposal would not have a direct fiscal impact on their organization. Oversight does not have any information to the contrary. Therefore, Oversight will reflect a zero impact on the fiscal note.
