#### FISCAL ANALYSIS

### **ASSUMPTION**

Sections 334.702 - 334.726

Officials from the **Department of Insurance**, **Financial Institutions and Professional Registration (DIFP)** assume this bill is anticipated to have no fiscal impact to DIFP. However, should the extent of the work be more than anticipated, the department would request additional appropriation and/or FTE through the budget process.

For the purpose of the proposed legislation, and as a result of excessive caseloads, the **Office of the State Public Defender (SPD)** state that they cannot assume existing staff effective representation for any new cases arising where indigent persons are charged with the proposed new crime with the enhanced penalties for acting as an Athletic Trainer and violating the provision of 334.700 to 334.725 - a new class B misdemeanor.

In Fiscal Year 2018 - SPD's Trial Division did not open any cases under charge code 334.725.

While the number of new cases (or cases with increased penalties) may be too few or uncertain to request additional funding for this specific bill, the SPD will continue to request sufficient appropriations to provide effective representation in all cases where the right to counsel attaches.

**Oversight** assumes the SPD can absorb the additional caseload that may result from this proposal.

Officials from the **Office of the Secretary of State (SOS)** assume many bills considered by the General Assembly include provisions allowing or requiring agencies to submit rules and regulations to implement the act. The SOS is provided with core funding to handle a certain amount of normal activity resulting from each year's legislative session. The fiscal impact for this fiscal note to the SOS for Administrative Rules is less than \$5,000. The SOS recognizes that this is a small amount and does not expect that additional funding would be required to meet these costs. However, the SOS also recognizes that many such bills may be passed by the General Assembly in a given year and that collectively the costs may be in excess of what the office can sustain with the core budget. Therefore, the SOS reserves the right to request funding for the cost of supporting administrative rules requirements should the need arise based on a review of the finally approved bills signed by the governor.

# ASSUMPTION (continued)

**Oversight** assumes the SOS could absorb the costs of printing and distributing regulations related to this proposal. If multiple bills pass which require the printing and distribution of regulations at substantial costs, the SOS could require additional resources.

Officials from the Department of Health and Senior Services, the Department of Social Services, the Department of Mental Health, the Department of Elementary and Secondary Education, the Missouri Consolidated Health Care Plan, the Office of the State Treasurer, the Department of Corrections, the Office of the State Courts Administrator, the Office of Prosecution Services and the Department of Public Safety - Missouri Highway Patrol each assume the proposal will have no fiscal impact on their respective organizations.

**Oversight** notes that the above mentioned agencies have stated the proposal would not have a direct fiscal impact on their organization. Oversight does not have any information to the contrary. Therefore, Oversight will reflect a zero impact on the fiscal note.
