Oversight notes that the **Department of Health and Senior Services** has stated the proposal would not have a direct fiscal impact on their organization. Oversight does not have any information to the contrary. Therefore, Oversight will reflect a zero impact in the fiscal note for this organization.

Oversight notes provisions of 195.805.2 provides for departmental sanctions, including administrative penalties, for any licensed or certified entity regulated by the Department of Health and Senior Services that designs, produces, or markets medical marijuana products that would appeal to persons under eighteen years of age. Administrative penalties are distributed to school districts based on the location of the entity receiving the penalty. It is unknown whether penalties will be imposed or how much in penalties may be distributed to school districts. Therefore, Oversight will present penalties to school districts as \$0 to Unknown, for fiscal note purposes.

FISCAL IMPACT - Small Business

This proposal may impact small business manufacturers and sellers of medical marijuana products.

FISCAL DESCRIPTION

This act prohibits the sale of medical marijuana products that are designed, produced, or marketed in a manner to appeal to persons under 18 years of age, including, candies, gummies, lollipops, cotton candy, or products in the shape of a human, animal, or fruit. Any medical marijuana licensed or certified entity regulated by the Department of Health and Senior Services found to have violated this act shall be subject to Department sanctions, including an administrative penalty.

This legislation is not federally mandated, would not duplicate any other program and would not require additional capital improvements or rental space.
