FISCAL ANALYSIS

ASSUMPTION

Officials from the Department of Labor and Industrial Relations, Department of Public Safety-State Emergency Management Agency, Department of Corrections, Department of Public Safety-Missouri State Highway Patrol, and the Department of Transportation each assume the proposal will have no fiscal impact on their respective organizations.

Officials from the **Springfield Police Department** and **Boone County Sheriff's Department** assume the proposal will have no fiscal impact on their organization.

Oversight notes that the Department of Labor and Industrial Relations, Department of Public Safety-State Emergency Management Agency, Department of Corrections, Department of Public Safety-Missouri State Highway Patrol, Department of Transportation, Springfield Police Department, and Boone County Sheriff's Department have stated the proposal would not have a direct fiscal impact on their organization. Oversight does not have any information to the contrary. Therefore, Oversight will reflect a zero impact on the fiscal note for these agencies.

Officials from the **Department of Public Safety-Capitol Police** did not respond to Oversight's request for fiscal impact.

Oversight only reflects the responses that we have received from state agencies and political subdivisions; however, other local law enforcement, fire protection districts, ambulance districts, and emergency responders were requested to respond to this proposed legislation but did not. For a general listing of political subdivisions included in our database, please refer to www.legislativeoversight.mo.gov.

Oversight, upon review, realized that this could impact the Office of Administration (OA), as well as cities and counties and sent them a request for information on February 12, 2019. As of the printing of this fiscal note, Oversight has not received a response from OA or the political subdivisions (except for Kansas City below). However, Oversight assumes this proposal could increase the number of workers compensation claims. Therefore, Oversight will reflect a potential unknown amount of cost to the state and political subdivisions.

Officials from the **City of Kansas City** state this will have a significant negative financial impact on the City, as we have the largest number of firefighters in the State of Missouri and they are all exposed to stressful events during the course and scope of their occupational duties. The workers' compensation costs for medical care, wage loss payments and payments for permanent partial or permanent total disability will increase.

FISCAL IMPACT - Small Business

No direct fiscal impact to small businesses would be expected as a result of this proposal.

FISCAL DESCRIPTION

This act provides that if, preceding the date of injury or death, an employee who is on active duty as a first responder is diagnosed with a mental impairment and such person was not previously diagnosed such an impairment, then the impairment shall presumptively be considered an occupational disease and shall be presumed to have arisen out of and in the course of employment. This presumption may be rebutted by the employer or insurer.

FISCAL DESCRIPTION (continued)

One or more compensable mental impairment claims arising out of a single accident shall constitute a single injury. Furthermore, a mental impairment shall not be considered an occupational disease if it results from a disciplinary action, work evaluation, job transfer, layoff, demotion, promotion, termination, retirement, or similar action taken in good faith by the employer.

This legislation is not federally mandated, would not duplicate any other program and would not require additional capital improvements or rental space.
