FISCAL ANALYSIS

ASSUMPTION

Section 324.009

Officials from the **Department of Health and Senior Services (DHSS)** assumes the proposed legislation revises the professional licensing reciprocity criteria necessary to qualify for a license in the state of Missouri, including nonresident military spouses. Applicants applying for licensure under the proposed legislation would fall under the same reciprocity process, fee, and review as current applicants. Changing regulations and applicant licensure reviews are within the normal ebb and flow for the Department, so minimal time and expense will be required to conduct the requirements of the proposed legislation.

The department anticipates being able to absorb these costs. However, until the FY20 budget is final, the department cannot identify specific funding sources.

Officials from the **Department of Insurance, Financial Institutions and Professional Registration**, the **Department of Revenue**, the **Department of Natural Resources**, the **Department of Agriculture**, the **Department of Transportation**, the **Department of Public Safety - Missouri Highway Patrol** and the **Office of Administration - Administrative Hearing Commission** each assume the proposal will have no fiscal impact on their respective organizations.

Oversight notes that the above mentioned agencies have stated the proposal would not have a direct fiscal impact on their organization. Oversight does not have any information to the contrary. Therefore, Oversight will reflect a zero impact on the fiscal note.
